## アーティスト・イン・レジデンス展

Seto International Ceramic and Glass Art Exchange Program

1000年以上のやきものの歴史を誇る瀬戸は、陶土とともにガラス原料となる珪砂の産地でもあります。このような背景から、工芸美術の新たな展開のために、2000年からアーティスト・イン・レジデンス」を開催し、日本を含めて26カ国総勢68名の陶芸家とガラス作家が参加しています。本展覧会では、13人の作家が制作した陶芸とガラスの作品を展示いたします。

Seto city is famous for its ceramic products and has more than 1000 years of history. It is also a producing region of silica sand, which is a raw material used for making glass, and clay. The "Artist in Residence" program has been held to develop new arts and crafts with these backgrounds. From 2000, we have invited 68 ceramic and glass artists from 26 countries, including Japan. In this exhibition, we exhibit ceramic and glass works of art executed by 13 artists.
